

944.631.901.902.EU and US plastic replacement lenses.

These very high quality plastic lenses fit only the non 924S, non turbo 944, & 944S cars.

They DO NOT fit the Turbo or S2 cars.

To install them into YOUR reflector assembly YOU must remove first the old glass parts of the lens. If your old lenses are not broken and just pitted or scratched, you will have to break the old lens carefully with out destroying your old backing housing that has the reflector in it. You must use this part back.

Use safety glasses and break the glass, then using pliers or similar device pull out the broken pieces of glass from the surrounding sealant that was used when the lens/reflector assembly was first put together. With a little patience and the proper tools you can get the old sealant out with out destroying the old housing. I suggest a small flat bladed screwdriver to gently pry out the old small pieces of remaining glass attached with the sealant. Be careful !!!

Once you have removed the old glass and have a flat surface you can insert the new plastic lenses into the groove left where the old sealant was. Make sure it fits flat before you apply any new sealant.

While the assembly is apart and before you glue the new lens back in, VERY GENTLY clean the reflector without scratching it. Use some warm soapy water and a very soft brush like a paint brush to remove the dust and broken powdered glass. Then gently dry the surface with a soft lint free rag. Remove the bulb and clean it with alcohol to remove oils from your hands, and then replace it in the reflector. Dry all parts completely.

Once you get the lens to fit properly remove it from the frame and apply a little silicone sealant into the old groove. Do not overdo it as you will just have to wipe it off later or it will also squeeze inside and look bad. Take a piece of masking tape and wrap around the fitted lens and let dry for a few hours. Once it has dried, remove the tape and install you new lenses back into your car.

You have just saved over \$100.00 for the pair and they look like new again.
